



D. kupensis is so far only known from Mount Kupe and the Bakossi Mountains, where about 6 collections have been made since its discovery in 1995. It is an understorey tree, 1.5 – 3m, rarely reaching 5m, occurring at 700 –1250 m altitude on well-drained slopes of undisturbed sub-montane forest. It is one of a number of small trees endemic to Kupe-Bakossi, such as Coffee montkupensis and Cola sp. nov. It is conspicuous in fruit, bearing yellow-orange fruits almost 2cm in diameter.

Kupe-Bakossi has recently been included in a proposed government reserve, which should offer a higher level of protection to the forest and life within it. Immediate threats to this species are primarily from understorey clearance for crop plantation.
